Declared outbreak of Queensland Fruit Fly (QFF) in Sunraysia



A Queensland fruit fly eradication program has commenced in Mildura following the recent detection of a female fruit fly which was carrying eggs.

The Sunraysia community plays a vital role in the QFF eradication program. It is critical to prevent QFF from spreading and impacting on horticultural production and marketing of produce from the region.

The eradication program has begun in a 1.5 kilometre radius from the outbreak, and a leaflet describing the program has been delivered to affected households.

DPI teams and contractors will visit all properties within the zone to conduct larvae searches and to apply bait into the canopy of suitable trees to attract and kill fruit flies.

DPI staff and contractors carry personal identification at all times and residents should ask to see that identification when they visit their property.

Householders can help by providing easy access to their backyards and by not removing any home grown fruit from their property unless it is treated by cooking the fruit to kill any fruit fly maggots.

Alternatively, unwanted fruit can be picked, placed in a plastic bag and either placed in a freezer for two days or left in the sun for at least three days, to kill any maggots in the fruit. The bag can then be disposed of in the garbage.

Unwanted fruit should not be composted or placed directly into the garbage.

Most fruits (including citrus, table grapes, wine grapes, stone and pome fruit, berries, tomatoes, capsicums and chillies) are hosts of Queensland fruit fly.

Residents of the Nangiloc/Colignan district will have the opportunity to attend one of two information sessions presented by Community Safety CFA. The first one hour information session will be held at the Colignan Mud Hut, Kulkynne Way, Colignan on the 10th of February commencing at 7.30pm.

Community Educators are currently busy hosting information sessions throughout Victoria, encouraging all community members to prepare for the possibility of fire in their area this 'fire season'. The message from the Community Safety is that everyone needs to be prepared for bushfire, and to assist residents to achieve this goal, special kits have been developed. The information packages called 'Your Bushfire Survival Kit' will guided members of the public through each area of preparation that they should complete to be fully prepared.

All residents are encouraged to attend their local information session to hear first hand what they can do to prepare their property, their families and themselves, to achieve the best possible outcome if they become involved in a fire. At these sessions they will also be provided with their copy of "Your Bushfire Survival Kit". For those who cannot attend the information session, kits can be obtained from your local regional office or by calling the 'Victorian Bushfire Information Line' on 1800 240 667.
