

Back in time...

The Community Spirit

Published on Friday, 11th January 1924 The Burnie Advocate, Tasmania.

The spirit of mutual support that has helped overcome the challenges of the mallee settlement was beautifully demonstrated last week at Nangiloc (Vic), one of the new soldier settlements in the wheat-growing region along the Murray.

A settler named Tancoe fell ill and required surgery just as his first wheat crop was ready for harvest.

In response, thirty neighbours, with fifty horses, seven harvesters and two wagons, worked together to harvest and transport four hundred bags of wheat in a single day. Additionally, thirty tons of hay were carted and stacked.

The women of the district also contributed by preparing meals for the workers.
