A favourite ANZAC tradition

ANZAC biscuits have become a symbol of remembrance in Australia and New Zealand, especially linked to the soldiers who fought during World War I. These sweet, oat-based biscuits were originally made by the wives, mothers and women's groups on the home front to send to the ANZACs, Australian and New Zealand Army Corps, serving overseas.

Unlike traditional baked goods, ANZAC biscuits contained no eggs, which were scarce due to rationing. Instead, they were made with ingredients like oats, golden syrup, coconut, flour, butter, sugar and baking soda. This combination not only made them nutritious but also long-lasting, capable of surviving the long sea journey to Europe and the Middle East.

Though often thought of as battlefield rations, it's more likely these biscuits were sent as care packages, a comforting reminder of home.

Over time, the humble ANZAC biscuit has become a culinary icon and a powerful symbol of national pride and remembrance, particularly on ANZAC Day.

ANZAC BISCUITS.

Place in a saucepan

$\frac{1}{4}$ cup butter

2 tab. boiling water

1 t ab. golden syrup

1 teaspoon soda

Heat until it froths

adding soda last

Add to mixture

1 cup sugar

1 cup flour

1 cup oats rolled

1 cup coconut.

Mix all together and place small balls flattened with

a fork on a greased tray

Bake in mod. oven 350" for 12-15 mins

History of the Nangiloc CFA

The Nangiloc Country Fire Authority (CFA) brigade has been a cornerstone of community safety in the Nangiloc Colignan area of northwest Victoria.

The initiative to establish a rural fire brigade for this region was first proposed in 1970, when the Victorian Country Fire Authority was approached for approval.

Over the years, the Nangiloc CFA brigade has evolved to meet the growing needs of the community. In May 2012, a new fire station was officially opened, replacing the old shed. This upgrade was made possible through funding from the State Government's Rural Fire Station Replacement Program.

Since 2008, the Nangiloc CFA has been equipped with a 2.4C Medium Tanker, a Hino Ranger 5Z model, featuring a 2,350-litre water tank and a 40-litre Class A foam tank. This vehicle is designed to accommodate a crew of five and plays a crucial role in the brigade's firefighting efforts.

Beyond emergency response, the Nangiloc CFA plays an active role in the local community. The brigade attends local events, providing support and raising fire safety awareness. A highlight of their community involvement is their role in safely transporting Santa to our local Christmas celebrations, bringing joy to the children and families while reinforcing their connection to the community.

In addition, the Nangiloc CFA station serves as a valuable community resource. The CFA has generously loaned the building to the NCDCA, allowing it to be used for community meetings and training courses while awaiting the renovation of the community hall. The NCDCA is incredibly grateful and appreciative of the CFA for allowing us to utilise their space, demonstrating their unwavering commitment to the community beyond firefighting.

This partnership strengthens community ties and ensures that the station serves not only as a base for emergency response but has also been a hub for local engagement and education.

Throughout its history, the Nangiloc CFA brigade has played a vital role in protecting and supporting the local community, adapting to changing demands, and fostering a strong community spirit.
