Stay Safe and Support Our Growers!





Recipe of the month...

AUSSIE BEER CAMP OVEN DAMPER

Travellers-Fare

Ingredients:

- 🗌 1 can of beer different beers create different flavours
- 🗌 2 tablespoons oil 🗌 1 teaspoon sugar 🗌 2 cups self-raising flour
- 🗌 1 mixing bowl 🗌 1 camp oven (or kitchen oven)

Instructions:

- 1. Prepare fire or preheat oven.
- 2. Put beer, oil and sugar in a mixing bowl.
- 3. Add self-raising flour and mix until there is a doughy consistency. You may need to use your hands to mix. If it is dry add more beer and if it is too wet add more flour until you get a nice dough consistency.
- 4. Put some foil on the bottom of your camp oven then put dough onto foil, usually in a round state.
- 5. With a knife mark into wedges.
- 6. Cook in camp oven with hot coals on top for about 15 minutes or until a lovely golden colour. You can check if it is ready by tapping on the bread if it sounds hollow it is ready. (Another cooking option is to wrap the dough in foil and put in the fire).
 7. Serve warm with butter or with whatever you like.
