A big thank you to everyone involved for helping make this project happen – it's a fantastic boost for Iraak and for all who enjoy spending time on our river.





Awakening of the Murray Frontages


From "the Silences" to the Day of Settlement and Production

A few years ago "Steele Blayde" of the Mildura Cultivator used to take long jinker jogs into the silences surrounding Mildura, behind a wonderful little horse called Jack. Then he would come back and describe "the lands of possibility."

Those lands were wonderfully lovable as pine, belar and mallee stretches, as open blue-bush plains, or box flats—always the lands of possibility.

Merbein, then in its infancy, developed with marvellous speed. The dry areas along the Yelta channels, fed by irrigation, were cleared and worked bit by bit.

The Yatpool–Carwarp–Ginquam–Koorlong dry-farming country was progressively opened up; yet still "back of beyond" lay silences where boundary riders or stockmen roamed, and where sheep and cattle vied with hopping kangaroos and stalking emus for the range....to be continued next addition



Recipe of the month & test your knowledge...

EASY 3-INGREDIENT LEMONADE SCONES

Ingredients:

- 3 ½ cups self-raising FLOUR (plus extra for dusting)
- ☐ 1 cup thickened CREAM
- ☐ 1 cup lemonade (Sprite and 7Up works too)

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 200°C (180°C fan). Line a TRAY with BAKING paper.
- 2. Mix flour, cream and lemonade in a large bowl until just combined (don't overmix). Dough should be soft and sticky.
- 3. Turn out onto a floured surface. Gently knead 3–5 times, then pat into a round disc about 2.5cm thick.
- 4. Cut scones with a floured round CUTTER (press straight down, no twisting).
- 5. Place on tray so they're just touching. Brush tops lightly with MILK.
- 6. Bake for 15 minutes, until GOLDEN on top.
- 7. Serve WARM with JAM WHIPPED cream.
