Sunraysia Daily (Mildura, Vic) Monday, 16 October 1922

Awakening of the Murray Frontages

From "the Silences" to the Day of Settlement and Production

Then came the war—and in its wake, wonderful change. Birdwood No. 1 was added to Merbein; then Merbein West; later, Birdwood Nos. 2 and 3. So great was the demand for soldiers' land that the "debenture-holders'" tract was purchased by the Government and, under the name Red Cliffs, embarked upon settlement.

For a time, sufficient land seemed to meet immediate needs; but many inclined toward dry-country farming and wheat-growing rather than irrigation and fruit. Further land in the Mildura region was opened, and now agricultural settlement has stretched past Red Cliffs—where Karadoc station once lay—toward Nowingi and Hattah, beyond Lake Iraak, across Colignan, and west to the railway via Nurnurimal. These "silences" have begun to fill with people.

Thus it was that on Monday, October 9, "Steele Blayde" once more mounted old Jack—lent for the occasion—and headed upriver. The journey via Red Cliffs no longer passed through pine, belar, and mallee-covered wasteland, but instead through a vibrant patchwork of irrigated home-blocks criss-crossed by channels and teeming with activity.to be continued next addition

MMC CARAMELICIOUS FUDGE


A smooth, creamy treat that melts in your mouth!
