A refreshing family favourite, perfect for warm days by the river!

#### Ingredients:

- ☐ Finely grated rind of 2 lemons
- ☐ juice of 6 to 8 large lemons
- 1/2 to 3/4 cup good-quality honey (adjust to taste)
- 2 cups water

#### Method:

- 1. In a saucepan, combine all ingredients.
- 2. Heat gently, stirring often, for 8–10 minutes just below boiling.
- 3. Remove from heat and allow to cool on the bench.
- 4. Once cooled, transfer to the fridge to chill.

#### To serve:

Mix the syrup with equal parts cold water and coconut water (or swap for sparkling water for a fizzy twist).

Pour over ice and enjoy!
