Lunch will be provided!



# CHRISTMAS CAKE Easy Three Ingredients

Ingredients:

- ☐ 1kg (6 cups) dried fruit
- $\square$  600ml (2 1/2 cups) ice coffee
- ☐ 300g (2 cups) self-raising flour

#### Method:

- Place the mixed fruit and ice coffee to into a large bowl, mix well cover with glad wrap and soak overnight in the fridge.
- 2. Preheat oven to 160 degrees, grease and line cake tin.
- 3. Stir self-raising flour through the fruit mixture and pour into prepared tin.
- 4. Bake for approximately 1 hour or until cake feels firm in the middle.

#### Alternatives:

Juice, black tea, coffee, alcohol or chocolate milk
